

Dear Friends,

February..... A time to think about love. I found it absolutely shocking to learn that in 2024, Americans spent \$25.8 billion on Valentine's Day. Why do we need to designate a certain day to show love?

Shouldn't the practice of loving others be extended far beyond a single day?. Since the concept of love is already deeply ingrained in our faith from the source of love – God, why can't we share the love of God with others every day?

Some days this is harder than others but focusing on God's love can be a more profound way to show affection and true Christian care to others.

God calls us to love one another! He <u>commands</u> us to love Him, love ourselves, and **love others**. In a world that seems more focused on hate and division, sometimes that's easier said than done. But if we are truly committed, with the power of the Holy Spirit, we can strive to be more Christ-like in the way we love.

God's Word tells us..., "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God because God is love" (1 John 4:7-8). Imagine then, just how much different could this community be if love began to spread throughout the streets? How much different would our churches be if we all truly showed genuine agape love to everyone?

The Apostle Paul sums up what love is NOT love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth" (1 Corinthians 13:4–8 Paul then tells us that we should love as God loves us—unconditionally, sacrificially, patiently, hopefully, kindly, without anger or resentment, and without arrogance or pride.

In today's darkened world, perhaps to love in this manner, when people disappoint, hurt, or betray us, is difficult. Indeed, without God's grace, the love He asks of us would be impossible. But with God, all things are possible

Because February focuses a lot on love, Valentine's Day can be a great platform to examine our hearts and see what areas of our lives we can show love in better ways. God's love is worth sharing, and it's worth changing our ways for. I challenge you this month to discover how can you show God's love to someone new.


